CHIEF JUSTICE INITIATES THE NATIONS FIRST JUDICIAL OUTREACH PROGRAM TO FIRST TIME HOME BUYERS

In a precedent setting judicial outreach program, on Saturday September 28th at 10:00 a.m. Chief Justice Daher in his court room will be teaching over 100 new and future owners of multi-family homes on their rights and responsibilities of being a landlord.
